The second to last event in the CASC-OR 2004 Mobil 1 Autoslalom Championship Series Sponsored by Williams Performance Friction season took place on September 19th at the Molson Centre in Barrie. The hosting club was the Twin Lakes Motorsport Club and the organizer was Tod Freer.

This large parking lot in Barrie was the scene of one of the more interesting events this year, with some classes being decided and some extremely close finishes, not to mention a few more upsets. The course was fast with some extremely tricky corners, one of which caught about a quarter of the field out at some point through the day causing lots of fast spins. The weather, although chilly in the morning, was an absolutely gorgeous day, sunny and low 20's.

The week leading up to this event had a lot of trash talk going on as well as lots of polls as to who would beat who

and who would set fastest time of the day. Old guys versus young guys, experienced versus inexperienced. Tony M. beat Andrew C. in his own car, Ryan K. on street tires beat Jason D. on race compound, and Bill R. beat everybody.... The best battle of the day though, was in H-Stock where the top six competitors were separated by under .6 seconds, with third through fifth separated by a mere 7/1000's of a second and fourth and fifth by 1/1000's of a second. Now that is close! 1/1000 of a second on a 54 second course, that's a couple of millimetres in distance, small enough that the human eye would not have been able to decide a winner. What makes it even more interesting is the fact that these are different cars, by different manufacturers, a 1993 Honda Civic CX and a 2000 Mazda Protégé.

And we have a new leader of the overall championship. David S. was in 46th place overall leading up to this event, but with his class win and now having completed the minimum event requirement, he, along with 47th and 48th places shot up toward the top of the standings. The drivers that had thought they had a good grasp on the series championship now have their work cut out for them.

The fastest time of the day went to Bill R. in his C-Mod Toyota MR2, just under three tenths of a second ahead of Tony M. driving a VW Golf GTi.

















This event was the best attended of the season with 102 official competitors. 19 classes were represented with 15 of them being considered full (three or more competitors). This was a great turn out for a club hosting their very first regional event and I do believe the club's biggest ever Solo 2 event. Twin Lakes did a great job!
