

CASC-OR 2007 Mobil 1 Autoslalom Championship Series Sponsored by Inside Track Motorsport News, **Event # 5 Report**



The CASC-OR 2007 Mobil 1 Autoslalom Championship Series Sponsored by Inside Track Motorsport News was back in action on Saturday September 15th after almost a two month hiatus. Round five of the six event Province wide series had SPDA and Organizer Andrew Ross organizing the penultimate event at Picton Airfield just outside of beautiful Picton Ontario. The event was the second double header weekend of the season and SPDA had teamed up with Eastern Ontario's St. Lac. to put on what turned out to be a fantastic weekend in St. Lac.'s backyard.



Picton Airfield was a British Air Force training facility during World War II and more recently been the site of the reality television show, Canada's Worst Driver. This weekend though, some of Ontario best Solo drivers descended on the old airfield for the final weekend in the Series.

The car count was a little lower than hoped for, but that did not mean the competition wasn't intense. The Overall Championship and a few classes were all but sewn up, but the remaining positions in the Overall were still up for grabs.

Despite the miserable weather on Friday evening, it was fairly windy and cool on this sunny mid-September day. As the event got under way, a little behind schedule, the clouds moved in but the precipitation held off, except for one brief sprinkle that managed to just get the surface slicked up enough

to make the runs interesting. Fortunately it only lasted ten minutes and only one run group had two runs compromised as a result.

SPDA had a cliquey title for their event, "Rumble at the Strip" and they managed to set up a very long course, around 2 kilometres, and it was wide open, pushing the rule book envelope with much higher speeds than your typical Autoslalom event. Picton Airfield consists of three runways that form a triangle and SPDA used almost two compete runways. The course was so long, in fact, that most people only had enough time for one course walk, which took the better part of a half hour to do, so arrangements were made to "shuttle" competitors around the course slowly in a pickup truck.

Also, when it came to marshalling changes, it was so far out to the two most remote marshalling stations that the marshals needed to be shuttled out so the event could continue with only a brief interruption for marshal changes.

Competition was good, although with the fastest times in the 77 second range there were a lot of class walks. The competitors with track or performance driving experience had a bit of an advantage due to the higher speeds and flowing nature of the course. The slalom on the back leg of the course was 45 paces between cones and cars were navigating through the cones around 100km/hour, much faster than the average slalom! It took nerves of steel to navigate this high pucker-factor course.



The closest battle had the top two C Super Stock competitors separated by six tenths, with John D. and his Miata edging out St. Lac. member Rob B. in

his Toyota MR2 for the class win. D Modified had last years third place Overall and St.Lac member, Bill R., in his chopped up "MR 1.5" beating out MCO's Bruce J. and his fenderless Nissan NX200, by six tenths as well.

In E Super Stock, the biggest class of the day, SPDA's Daniel F. nudged fellow SPDA member Peter W., in his own car no less, by another six tenths margin. Six tenths of a second may seem like a lot, but on an 82 second run, it really is just more than a blink of an eye.... Doug P. and his Camaro Z28 was a close third, only three tenths back of Peter and another two tenths back was fellow Toronto F Body Club member Ben W. and his Camaro SS.

There were also a couple of unexpected upsets to be had in the field. G Stock was missing the Series Director, Pete M., due to some issues with Pete's ride. The key competitor in G Stock, Series Timer Cliff S., was soundly beaten by HADA Motorsport Club's Travis T. in his Acura RSX Type S, much to Cliff's surprise.

Series Scrutineer, Mike H. and his VW Scirocco, laid a beating on SPDA's Joe T. in a borrowed Subaru Legacy wagon. In Joe's defence, the Legacy wagon was the Organizer's, Andrew R., F Super Stock ride, so Joe did well to place second in an under prepped car.















When it came down to the Overall Championship, the higher speed open course allowed some cars that are usually mired in the mid pack to shine and the top Seven Overall were all from different classes with eight class represented in the top 10. Fifth place overall with a score of 97.320 was the D Super Stock Cobalt SS of Ryan B, fourth the Subaru WRX Wagon of MCO/SPDA's Steven P... Third overall went to the H Stock Reaction Grafix\Tsunami Technology\CG-Lock\Wheel & Tire Zone\Pathfinder Lubricant Civic SiR of former Series Director, Wes T., with a score of 98.366 and just ahead of him was the D Street Prepared car of SDPA's Mike A. in second with a score of 98.677. The class of the field was the C Street Prepared Miata of Paul K. who took the Northern Motorsport Top Scorer Award with the perfect 100 points.

The fastest time of the day also went to Paul K. and his Miata with a time of 76.589 almost a half second quicker than Andrew C. in his Greenview/Can Alignment, Mannheim Motor Oil/Pathfinder Lubricant C Modified '75 VW Scirocco with a time of 77.027. Third was Mike A. with a time of 78.441.

The top scoring Novice for Event #6 was Loui P., in his E

Super Stock Subaru Legacy GT, whom has all but wrapped up the Novice Championship, followed by fellow SPDA member, Allen T. in his G Stock Impreza 2.5i.

With only one event left on the six event schedule, Paul's win, Mike's second place and Wes' third really tightened up the battle for second Overall with Marshall wrapping up his third Overall Championship and his first since 2003.
