2. 2024 Review

- -A 6 event series was planned, 4 events were held in 2024 (6 in 2023)
- -Average entries on Sat 49.5 (68.75)
- -Average entries on Sun 41.75 (71.5)



2. (III) 2024 Detailed review

Anne McCallum prepared a detailed analysis of 2024 CASC – OR entries

2. (III) 2024 Detailed review

- Average entry in 2024 was 91.25 (140.25) per event
- Estimated "cost" to run an event was \$13,000
- Average entry fees collected \$8,750 (\$13,300)
- Loss per event in 2024 was \$4,250

The two clubs that did not hold events each contributed \$2500 to reduce the losses, CASC-OR contributed about \$5,000 so the clubs that held events ended up absorbing about a \$2,000 loss each.

Obviously, we cannot afford to do that again...

II. 2025 Rule changes

- II. 2025 Rule changes
- 2.1.12 Lights
- All cars shall have 3 rear facing lights:
- 1 running light
- 2 brake lights
- Running Lights:
- Cars shall have one clearly visible 55 watt halogen fog light or LED rearward facing fog light amber or white (prefer yellow or orange) running lights.
- Brake Lights:
- Two clearly visible 24 watt rearward facing brake lights. Brake lights can be relocated, factory installed 3rd brake light (counts and 1 light regardless of bulbs installed or D.O.T. trailer brake lights.

II. 2025 Rule changes

- 2.1.21 TOWING HOOK
- All race cars shall have a solid tow hook or equivalent at both the front and rear of the vehicle. (Tip

 chain or strap/aircraft cable is preferred)
- Tow hooks shall not protrude beyond the bodywork of the vehicle.
- Must have 2" gap for recovery gear.

Note: special care should be taken to make certain recovery points are not sharp



- II. 2025 Rule changes
- 2.1.22 AIR BAGS
- Air bag light must be on DUE TO, airbag module, fuses removed or all airbags removed preferred.



II. 2025 Rule changes

- 2.2.1 RUBBER TO ICE
- CLASS 1: All rear wheel drive up to 5000cc being less than a maximum 4801mm overall length as measured at the racetrack.
- CLASS 2: Front engine, front wheel drive up to 4000cc and being less than a maximum 4801mm overall length as measured at the racetrack.
- CLASS 4: Specials, modified, and 4WD, up to 4000cc and being less than a maximum 4801mm overall length as measured at the racetrack.
- Cars are restricted to uni-body style only, full frame vehicles are not allowed.



II. 2025 Rule changes

2.3 NUMBERS

- Height: 10" (250mm) or more
- Stroke Width:(thickness of number font) 1.5" (38mm) or more
- 2.4 BUMPERS
- 2.4.1 Bumpers shall be designed not to hook or lock together with bumpers on another Car.
 Bumpers shall be securely fastened to the car. Stock bumpers can be used but require
 secondary latching (bridging to fenders or lag bolts).



- II. 2025 Rule changes
- 2.5.2 STREET STUDS
- a) Only D.O.T. approved tires may be used and D.O.T. approved not for competition, farm or off-road use – Ice Race Head Scrutineer will have the final say on tires. Tires must be prestudded by the manufacturer.
- 2.7.2 For all cars a minimum of a fully functioning three-point safety **seatbelt** shall be installed **and functioning as designed when new**.
- 2.7.6 Seat belts must not be torn, ripped or damaged.
